Answering Questions God Asks in Scripture

When we think of "hearing God," most of us think of God giving direction, like "Move to Timbuktu." We think of God telling us what to do.

But Scripture paints a different picture of hearing God. It's more relational, conversational even. Most conversations begin when one person introduces a topic. Our friends want to tell us of their kids acting in a school play, and we talk with them about it. Sometimes it's even hard to change the subject.

How can we have a conversation with God and let him introduce the topic? How can we let him steer the conversation? One of the best ways I know is to answer any question God asks in Scripture.

Some of my best prayer times have begun by answer one of these questions, telling God what I think, feel, hope, and fear. And then letting him converse back.

Over the years, I've collected scores of questions God asks in Scripture. Below are some of my favorite.

To Adam and Eve:

- Where are you? (Gen. 3:9)
- Who told you that you were naked? (Gen. 3:11)
- Have you eaten of the tree I commanded you not to eat? (Gen. 3:11)
- What is this you have done? (Gen. 3:13)

To Cain after he murdered Abel: "Where is your brother?"

To Jacob, as he fought with the angel of the Lord, "What is your name?"

To Sarah when she laughed in disbelief, "Why did you laugh?"

To Hagar, as she despaired in the desert, "What is the matter, Hagar?"

To Job:

- "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?" (Job 38:2)
- "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? (Job 38:4)
- "Do you give the horse his might? Do you clothe his neck with a mane? Do you make him leap like the locust? His majestic snorting is terrifying" (Job 39:19-20)

To Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul since I've removed the kingship from him?"

To King David (an unspoken question when Nathan confronts him), "What should be done to this man?" (2 Sam. 12:1-6)

And if you greet your brethren only, what is unusual about that? Do not the unbelievers do the same? (Matt 5:47)

Why are you anxious about clothes? Matt 6:28

Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye yet fail to perceive the wooden beam in your own eye? (Matt 7:2)

Why are you terrified? (Matt 8:26)

Why do you harbor evil thoughts? (Matt 9:4)

Do you believe I can do this? (Matt 9:28)

Who is my mother? Who are my brothers? (Matt 12:48)
