If we receive the good in things joyfully as an expression of God's goodness, we will delight in the generosity and love of our Father, and seek to know more of His heart through His good gifts, and we will find that eternal life has begun for us already.

Our capacity to receive the pleasure He intended for us will keep growing until it triumphs over and forgets all the pain.

If we seek good things independently for ourselves, we'll keep grabbing, hoarding, manipulating, and corrupting, taking our attention further away from from our Father, and we will find that hell has begun for us already.

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A heart trained by worship can rejoice even in hardship, grief, and loss.

It can rest in the promise that God is working all things together for good, so even this is a good gift from His perfect hand.

He is with us in it, so there is grace for us in it. It pushes us closer to our Father and deepens our connection to Him and appreciation for Him and ultimately grows our delight in Him.
